Community Engagement Mission

- Improving the health of communities through community engaged research and participatory bidirectional capacity building, especially areas where health disparities are pronounced.
- Community Engagement plays an important role in linking OSU Researchers with communities in southeastern Ohio.





Community Engagement of Southeast Ohio:

- Encourage community involvement:
 - Identifying and prioritizing problems;
 - Providing input into relevant research questions;
 - Contributing to research design and methods;
 - Developing culturally sensitive and ethical proposals;
 - Enhancing recruitment and retention of participants;
 - Implementing and disseminating research findings.





CE of Southeast Ohio Satellite Office

- Embedded in the community of southeast Ohio and located in Portsmouth, Ohio.
- Have access to administrative conference room.
- Availability of conference rooms for rental in same building.
- Welcome Center houses other entities that allow exposure to many community members.

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Community Partners

Community Advisory Board

- CAB consists of representatives of the community in southeast Ohio.
- Gives important feedback to the researchers.
- Gives the community a voice and an avenue to interact with the research community.
- Provides valuable insight into the dynamics of the community.
- Enhances communications.
- Researchers can disseminate information.






Community Engagement Advisory Board of Southeast Ohio

- 20 members from diverse backgrounds (churches, health departments, agency on aging, schools, OSU extension offices, community members, healthcare, domestic violence shelter).
- This group meets quarterly.
- Helps members understand more about research, expanding and encourages participation in the research process.
- Helps identify disparities and relevant issues/interventions of the community.
- Provides feedback to researchers.
- Opportunity for community organizations to find out what is going on in southern Ohio.

An example: Community Engagement in SE Ohio

- Problem identified from Community Advisory Board of SE Ohio—Hep C.
- Reach into OSU to find researchers interested in this problem.
- Researchers invited to Board meeting.
- Collaborations began between Dr. Jennifer Syvertsen and Scioto Community.
- R21 submitted, followed by larger U submission (Miller, PI).
