
Recruitment and Retention can help design those first touch points with the community and share best practices to help researchers achieve their recruitment/retention goals.



- 2. Create project at myccts.osu.edu
- 3. Complete Social Media Intake Form: go.osu.edu/fbrequest
- 4. R+R will work with you to schedule a meeting to review drafted ad
- 5. CCTS Communications team will send you needed details for IRB submission
- 6. After IRB approval you will notify recruitment services you are ready to run your ad and submit a requisition into Workday with the estimated cost of running the Facebook Advertisement.




MyChart for Recruitment

MyChart for Recruitment sends patients messages within the MyChart application

- Potentially eligible volunteers are identified via a query using Research Informatics Services.
- The list of the identified individuals is sent to an Honest Broker.
- The Honest Broker sends the "Recruitment Request". This pushes the study description and recruitment boiler plate language out to the potential volunteer.
- 4. The message will not be sent if the patient is NOT MyChart Active or has refused to receive MyChart Recruitment messages

There are a few things that we suggest to anyone who has access to the internet and is interested in participating in research at OSU:

 We encourage you to consider registering as a potential research study volunteer on <u>ResearchMatch.org</u>. It is a very secure registry for people who are willing to be considered as a participant in research studies. It will take about 5 minutes to complete the registry. If you also have children, it's a good idea to register them as well. There are many studies seeking volunteers that are appropriate for children as well as adults with all health conditions as well as those without any health issues.

2. The Ohio State University has a listing called <u>StudySearch</u> of many of the studies that are seeking volunteers. There are hundreds of studies ongoing at OSU, and this listing represents many but not all of them. 



19,753 volunteers and **22** institutions joined ResearchMatch in 2022. ResearchMatch now supports **144,745** volunteers with the following demographics:






